Fr. Alexii Altchul Biography:

Founder:

 Holy Archangel Michael & All Angels Skete, Weatherby, MO, and

Reconciliation Services, Kansas City, MO \Diamond Fr. Alexii began his journey to Orthodoxy as an insurance salesman, inspired by the scriptural command to love and serve the poor. He began taking food to families on Linwood Ave., an east -side community of Kansas City suffering multigenerational poverty and trauma. It was here that Fr. Alexii met the woman who would become his wife, Thelma Beaver. She was African American, considerably older, raised in poverty and had lived a life riddled with trauma, violence, and addictions. But despite her struggles, Thelma had the heart of a saint, housing and feeding strangers in her small apartment.

Fr. Alexii quit his job and with Thelma began caring for the residents and neighborhoods near Linwood. They were married in 1986 and founded Reconciliation Ministries. The ministry began by offering hot meals to anyone in need. Their journey to Orthodoxy continued, and in the 1990s they committed their work to prayer. Eventually, their small community at Reconciliation Ministries became St. Mary of Egypt Orthodox Church under the Serbian Diocese of the Midwest. Thelma became Matushka Michaela, named for the Archangel Michael. After earning his master's degree in social work in 2005, Fr. Alexii transitioned Reconciliation Services into a nonprofit agency, functioning separately but as an extension of the Orthodox churches and other communities of compassion in Kansas City.

After Matushka Michaela passed away in 2012, Fr. Alexii began pursuing a life of monasticism. He was tonsured a hieromonk and founded a monastery in Weatherby, MO.

Vision:

Goals:

Immediate Goals:

- Embed an annual pan-Orthodox Colorado retreat into the DNA and calendars of our Colorado parishes. The retreats will explore the many ways we can be the Hands and Feet of Christ, the Good Samaritan.
- 2. Annually host an **Orthodox Day of Service** during Great Lent where Colorado Orthodox parishes join together in alms-giving to serve our neighbors who are in need.

Our hope is to encourage and help Colorado parishes build and expand their existing outreach efforts.

Longer Term Goals:

There is strong desire from many people, representing many parishes to establish:

- 1. An Orthodox spiritual presence in one of Denver's neighborhoods of need. The Orthodox presence would include addressing the community's spiritual, physical and emotional needs.
- 2. A home for homeless women or women who have been trafficked. An exploratory committee has been established to identify how such a home might be established in Colorado.

As the Reader chants "Lord, I have cried" the deacon (or priest) stands before the Holy Altar with the censer, and says to the celebrant "Master bless the incense." The first priest blesses the incense saying: "Blessed is our God, always, now, and ever, and to the ages of ages. We offer incense to You, Christ our God, as a scent of spiritual fragrance; accept it at Your supra-heavenly altar, and send down upon us in return the grace of Your all-holy Spirit." The censing of the church begins at the words "Let my prayer be set forth..."

CHANTER: Set, O Lord, a watch before my mouth, and a door of enclosure round about my lips.

Incline not my heart unto words of evil, to make excuse with excuses in sins,

With men that work iniquity; and I will not join with their chosen.

How can we not marvel that you became the mother of the Son of God the Father, O all-honorable Virgin! You were wholly blameless, and you experienced no union with a man, and you gave birth to Him, unfathered in the flesh, who unmothered was begotten of the Father before all ages. He did not undergo any change or mixing or division, but He preserved intact the distinctive property of each nature. O Lady, we implore you, virgin Mother, to entreat Him for the salvation of the souls of all who profess the Orthodox belief that you are Theotokos.

The priest and the deacon prepare for the entrance with the Gospel by making three metanias in front of the altar.

Preceded by the candle bearers, the deacon exits through the north door, followed by the priest and concelebrating clergy in order of rank from junior to senior. As the Clergy exit, the deacon says:

DEACON: Let us pray to the Lord.

PRIEST: In the evening, at dawn, and at midday, we praise You, we bless You, we thank You, and we beseech You, O Master of

PRIEST: all, the Lord Who loves mankind. Guide our prayers, as incense before You, and do not let our hearts be inclined toward words or thoughts of evil, but save us from all who pursue our souls; do not put us to shame, O our God, for our eyes are fixed on You, Lord, O Lord, and we have hoped in You. For to You is due all glory, honor, and worship: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen. ***** Standing before the Beautiful Gates on the south side, the deacon points toward the Beautiful Gates with his orarion and says: DEACON: Master, bless the holy entrance. Blessing the entrance, the Priest: Blessed is the entrance of Your saints, always; now and PRIEST: ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen. The Deacon, standing before the priest, quietly censes the iconostasion, the concelebrating Clergy and the faithful. At the end of the Theotokion, the deacon says: DEACON: Wisdom. Arise. Lamp Lighting Hymn of Thanksgiving Clergy/People sing: Glad-some light of ho - ly glo of the ho - ly, ry bless ed, heav - en-ly, im-mor-tal Fa ther, O Je Christ. While the Entrance Hymn is sung, the Deacon finishes the censing, if not done, and the clergy enters the Holy of Holies through the Beautiful Gates as the hymn is sung. The deacon censes the clergy as they enter.

DEACON: The Evening Prokeimenon

The remaining clergy enter. The first deacon censes the clergy as they enter the Holy of Holies. If a single priest celebrates Vespers, he raises the censer, making the Sign of the Cross at the words, "... we praise You ...,"and enters the Holy of Holies.
